Circles



"Dialogue circles provide a safe, supportive space where all school community members can talk about sensitive topics, work through differences, and build consensus." (edutopia)

Purposes

- Peacemaking/Discipline
- Classroom culture
- Academic

Peacemaking Circles

- Occur after harm has been caused
- Component of restorative practices/restorative justice
- Goals:
 - Teach students how to maintain positive classroom culture
 - Address harms that take place in classroom
 - Cultivate student communication skills



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- Occur when classroom culture may feel toxic or uncultivated
- Goal: To build community



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Academic Circles

- Occur as part of a lesson
- Goal: Encourage student engagement with content on a personal level

1. Ground rules

a. Every member agrees to uphold

2. Opening

a. Often mindfulness exercise, not always related to prompt

3. Prompt

a. The meat of the circle: What are you there to talk about?

4. Closing

a. Encourages reflection

Students always have the right to opt out of answering

Ground Rules Examples (might change depending on type of circle)

- Use "I" statements
- Principle of non-interference
- Respect the talking piece
- Listen to understand
- Without feeling rushed, say just enough

Opening Examples

- Share a happy childhood memory.
- If you could be a superhero, which superpower would you choose and why?
- How would your best friend describe you?
- If you could talk to someone from your family who is no longer alive, who it would be? What would you want to talk about?

- If you had an unexpected free day and could anything you wished, what would you do?
- If you were an animal, what type would you be and why?
- What is a memory you have to time spent in nature?
- Who do you respect, and why?
- What would you NOT want to change about your life? Why?



- What happened and what were you thinking at the time of the incident?
- What have you thought about since?
- Who has been affected by what happened and how?

- What about this has been hardest for you?
- What do you think needs to be done to make things as right as possible?

Closure Examples

- What can each of us do to keep this from happening in the future?
- Share two words to describe your experience in the circle today.
- Could be a final question about a certain text/resource



Current Applications

- The entire San Francisco United School District uses circles as part of their restorative practices resolution
 - Drop in suspensions, especially for boys of color
- Many teachers already use components of circles, but perhaps not the entire framework
- Ed White Middle School, San Antonio, TX
 - 44% drop in suspensions in first year of implementation

Future Directions for Research

- Circles are most widely used for their peacemaking capacity at this point. What effects do academic circles have on student learning?
- Is the drop in suspensions we see as a result of restorative circles because more teachers are trying circles instead of suspensions, or because misbehavior is actually decreasing?

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
